PASTOR'S EPISTLE

I found this recently, spent some time with it, and decided to share it with you.

Perhaps you've encountered the phrase "giving back" when referencing matters of sharing, giving, philanthropy and stewardship. What is implied in this expression is a restoration of something to its rightful owner. The giver is called upon to exercise a sense of fairness, not to demonstrate generosity. This propensity to "giving back" creates and supports a life dominated by marketplace transactions rather than a life transformed by a faith-filled relationship with Jesus.

In John 3:16 we read, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." (NRSV).

This verse is all about "grace", a central Presbyterian focus. One might easily substitute the word, "generosity." Four points meld together in this one sentence to define stewardship and characterize the core value of every individual: "generosity."

- 1. God loved the world. (Relationship)
- 2. God gave. (Sharing)
- 3. God forfeited his only Son (Sacrificial)
- 4. God's gift was purposeful (Life-giving)

The great narratives in Scripture record God's work of generously shaping our relationships and behaviors. We also know that God is very concerned with how followers of Jesus invest generously not only time, talent, and treasure, but also how they engage relationships, power, knowledge, and the environment.

These words move members of congregations to live out generosity through what is called "first fruits", a percentage giving practice of 10-10-80 Sharing a first fruits gift places God at the center of our life. 10-10-80 financial practices will call us to adjust our financial behaviors by 1% of our income each year, moving toward a balance of Sharing 10% of our income, Saving 10% and Spending 80%. First-fruits giving (sharing) creates a culture of humility by moving ourselves out of the center and making God the focal point in our life (relational). Because of the size of the gift, we will need to budget for adjustments (sacrifice) in some areas of our life and in our core values, so that others might discover a changed and saved life, hope and hospitality (life-giving). This model encourages every follower of Jesus to joyously rest in a loving relationship with God, recognize and generously use assets for God's mission, and live generously toward God, family, neighbor and future generations

With those powerful words of John 3:16 echoing, let us at Scotch concentrate on generosity. Cultivate a generous faith, a generous spirit, a generous life.

Hand knit baby sweaters and blankets sent to the Malawi Crisis Nursery in Malawi, Africa by First Presbyterian Church of Potsdam.



The Knitting Group of the First Presbyterian Church of Potsdam has recently shipped two large boxes of hand knit baby sweaters and blankets to the Malawi Crisis Nursery in Malawi, Africa. This is the third biennial shipment made to support the Nursery that houses infants to two years olds whose families are unable to provide them with needed care. Adding to this project with beautifully hand knit items were the Fort Covington Presbyterian Church Women Knitters, The Presbyterian Church of Watertown Knitting Group, and the Peru Community Church 'Knit-Wits and Sew and Sews' as well as a number of generous participants from the community. More than 40 sweaters and more than 50 blankets were made as well as hats, buntings, bootles, and soft knitted dolls. In the middle of April two more boxes will be sent before the arrival of Malawi's cold season. Many thanks to all the caring people who made this mission so abundant and giving it the momentum to be ongoing.

RECEIVING TREASURER JOB DUTIES



Duties of Receiving Treasurer

- 1. Receive the weekly Sunday collection, accurately account for all receipts in their appropriate categories, and make deposit at Community Bank, Madrid. Report totals of collection categories to Disbursing Treasurer (DT).
- 2. Church receipts for account categories are currently managed with a Quick Books software program.
- 3. Receiving Treasurer (RT) is responsible for receiving and documenting all donations received outside of Sunday collections. Funds are deposited in either general checking account or SeaComm Money Market. Thank you notes are mailed to donor.
- 4. RT is responsible for documenting all Memorial Funds received, depositing them into Sea Comm Money Market account and sending thank you cards for gift.
- 5. RT, in working with DT, accounts for revenue from Presbyterian Women and Chipman Crew and make necessary deposits.
- 6. Receive and deposit quarterly dividends from investment funds and make necessary deposits in correct spending / saving account.
- 7. Provide statement of revenue to DT prior to every Session meeting so a complete year to date revenue and disbursement statement can be made available for Elders at their monthly meetings.
- 8. Make necessary withdrawals from SeaComm Money Market accounts for deposit into general checking account when Funded Reserves are needed to meet expenses.
- 9. RT mails out a Planned Giving statement in November of each year to every Planned Giving member, reflecting their pledge balance. [Note: Consideration is being given to making this a mid-year activity to provide current giving totals for each Giving member.]
- Meet with the DT, as required, to reconcile checking account.
- 11. RT prepares annual financial report for all monies received during year and meets with DT to review revenue and disbursement activities to reconcile with year end checking account balance.
- 12. Order 'Planned Giving' envelopes in November and assign giving envelope numbers to giving units and label. Also include annual Per Capita amount on envelope boxes.
- 13. DT is also available for assistance and guidance. It is important that our Church financial records are current and accurate.
