# **GREEN LEAVES**





Let us be reminded of the reason for the Easter season! Amongst all the busyness that goes on reflect on Jesus and His resurrection. Jesus said--- " I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die" (John 11:25)

**PASTOR'S EPISTLE.....** I recall my children kneeling at their beds repeating that old, familiar bedtime prayer, the one you probably learned as a child: "*Now I lay me down to sleep, I pray the Lord my soul to keep. If I should die before I wake. I pray the Lord my soul to take. And this I ask for Jesus' sake. Amen.*" They updated the last line some nights to: "*May angels watch me through the night and wake me with the morning light.*"

It's a lovely little prayer, just right for a child's bedtime. It asks for the small things that are important to children. After all, when you're young, what could be more important than being kept safe - especially when you don't know for sure what's under the bed or in that dark closet? Even today, that gentle prayer brings a kind of peace to my spirit.

When I wearily fall into bed at night, it's so easy to head back to comfortable, childhood prayers. Certainly there is nothing wrong with them. But maybe now, as my hair all but disappears and definitely grays and the corners of the day go far beyond what might lurk under the bed, I need to do more than rehearse those simple lines.

St. Paul said, "When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways" (1 Corinthians 3:11). Perhaps Paul is telling us that it's time to move beyond gentle prayers. Maybe now, when terrorists darken our future and the world cries out for hope, pleading for God's people to make a difference - maybe it's the right time for all of us to pray prayers more like this one:

Lord, we come into your presence seeking a gracious blessing. But we dare to ask for an outrageous portion of Your grace. We ask that You not simply equip us, but that You chase us to into Your world.

Make us people of vision who look not in but out, not backward but forward, not down but up, not at what cannot be done but at what might be accomplished by Your Spirit.

Make us those who seek mountains and not valleys, narrow paths instead of wide and easy ways, sending us new places instead of resting places, starts instead of finishes, horizons instead of waysides, tomorrows instead of yesterdays.

Give us running shoes instead of slippers, alarm clocks instead of sleep switches, accelerators instead of brakes, sailboats instead of sandcastles.

Make us startle even ourselves with the power that You give. For all we do is moved by Your breath, enveloped by Your spirit, filled with the wind of Your grace, and resounding to Your glory and not ours.

"Give us wings to fly like eagles" (Isaiah 40: 31). We pray in Jesus' name. Amen.

But then again, perhaps we couldn't want to say a prayer like that. After all, what if God answered with a mighty "YES"? Then where would we be? Would we be ready?

## The Easter Lily



#### Would you like to donate a lily to decorate the sanctuary this Easter

**season?** The Worship Committee asks that you please consider giving our sanctuary the renewal of Spring by donating an Easter bloom. If you wish to give in memory of a family member or friend, please provide the name to Mindy Fisher or Trudy Fisher so we can acknowledge your remembrance in the church bulletin.

This beautiful trumpet-shaped white flower symbolizes purity, virtue, innocence, hope and life- the spiritual essence of Easter. It is often called " white-robed apostles of hope". Lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ died on the cross. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprung up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in his final hours of sorrow. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by adorning their pulpits with Easter lilies, to signify the resurrection of Jesus Christ and the hope of eternal life. The Easter lily, along with other Easter blooms serves as a beautiful reminder that Easter is a time for rejoicing and celebrating!



## Palm Sunday—March 25, 2018

The colors of linen on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption In blood that Christ paid for the world. On Palm Sunday Christians celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem, the week before his death and resurrection. Palm Sunday ,often referred to as "Passion Sunday" marks the beginning of Holy Week, which concludes on Easter Sunday.

Jesus traveled to Jerusalem knowing that this journey would end in his sacrificial death on the cross for the sins of all mankind. Before he entered the city, he sent two disciples ahead to the village of Bethphage to look for an unbroken colt. The men brought the colt to Jesus, and placed their cloaks on its back. As Jesus sat on the young donkey he slowly made his humble entrance into Jerusalem. The people greeted Jesus enthusiastically, waving palm branches and covering his path with palm branches. The shouts of "Hosanna" meant "save now" and the palm branches symbolized goodness and victory. "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" Luke 19:28-38)

Repair of our church's organ was discussed at a congregational meeting on March 4th. The Finance Committee had previously met and reviewed the need for the repair and source of funds to pay for the replacement of the organ's two keyboards.

This organ was installed on October 21, 1994, 24 years ago. Within the last year, keys have begun "sticking" when being played. A representative from Rodgers Organ inspected the organ last Fall, and recommended replacing both keyboards due to the condition. Total cost for the Material, labor, and shipping is \$6,199. After many questions and a thor-

ough discussion, approval of the congregation was obtained. The Finance Committee recommended that the cost of the repair will be paid for using "unrestricted" Memorial funds.
